CALL TO ORDER AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Lee called the meeting of the Board of Zoning Appeals to order at 6:00 p.m. Commissioner Atkins moved to approve the November 17, 2015, Board of Zoning Appeals minutes as presented. Commissioner Garrett-Hensley seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING ON REQUEST OF INTERPRETATION OF THE MADISONVILLE ZONING ORDINANCE, SECTION 11-309. C-3 HIGHWAY BUSINESS DISTRICT, AS TO WHETHER MEDICAL RELATED OFFICES AND AN ADULT DAY CARE ARE THE SAME GENERAL NATURE AS THE EXPRESSLY PERMITTED USES WITHIN THE C-3 ZONING DISTRICT (Mary Teresa Harrison, Applicant)

Staff reviewed the expressly allowed uses within the C-3 and C-2 zoning districts. Per the Zoning Ordinance, all C-2 uses are permitted within the C-3 district. The C-2 district allows "offices", but does not expressly allow medical offices. The C-2 district also allows "hotels and boarding houses" and the C-3 district allows "hotels, motels, and tourist courts". Per Section 11-309., 2., of the Zoning Ordinance, any business or service, which in the opinion of the Board of Zoning Appeals is of the same general nature as the above permitted uses, is permitted. A general discussion followed.

Commissioner Wilson moved to interpret that medical related offices and adult day cares are similar to the other permitted uses within the C-3 and C-2 zoning districts. Commissioner Atkins seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-1 with Commissioner Harrill casting the dissenting vote.
